## Mission and Vision

The **mission** of the Chattahoochee Fall Line Conservation Partnership (CFLCP) is to provide technical expertise, strategic coordination, and leveraged resources for land conservation and ecosystem restoration along the Fall Line and nearby ecoregions in west Georgia and east Alabama in a manner compatible with the partners' conservation objectives, including the Army's ability to conduct highly effective military training on Fort Benning.

The **vision** for the Chattahoochee Fall Line region is a recovering, resilient, and sustainable landscape comprised of native wildlife and plant communities that include healthy, functioning, longleaf pine woodlands, streams, and wetlands; habitat for the red-cockaded woodpecker and gopher tortoise; thriving rare plant and animal communities of the sandhills, montane slopes, and wetlands; exemplary wildlife conservation; along with working farms and forests. The landscape will be economically sustainable and support forestry, farming, hunting, and other outdoor recreation, healthy watersheds, and tourism while simultaneously protecting the military training mission at Fort Benning.
